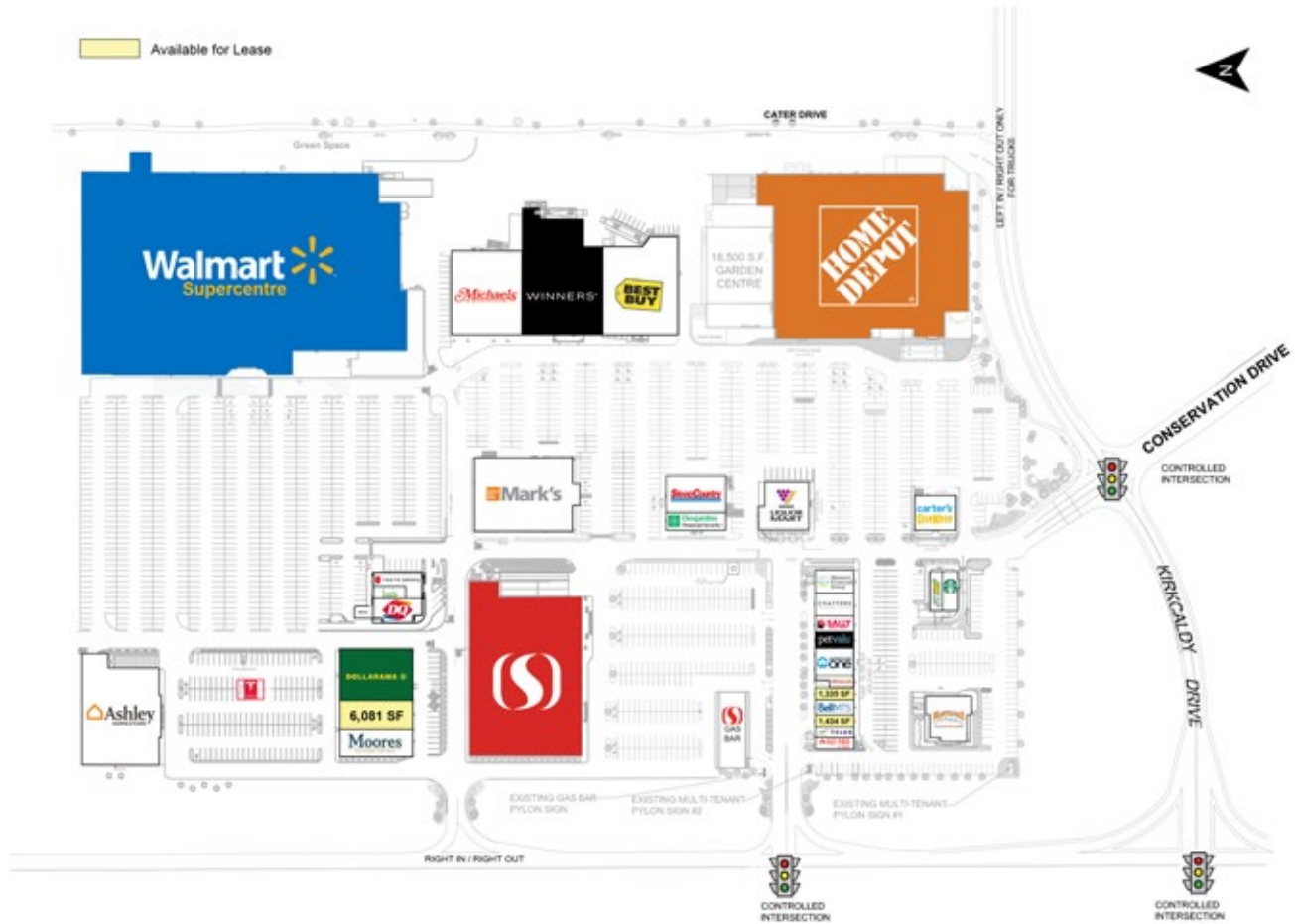

BRANDON - THE REGIONAL SERVICE CENTRE FOR WESTERN MANITOBA

Manitoba's second largest city, Brandon, is the regional service centre for Western Manitoba and has a population of over 63,000 and serves a trade area population of over 226,000 people¹.

Brandon was ranked **1st in Manitoba and 3rd in the Prairies** in MoneySense's Best Places to Live rankings and 7th in the Western Investor's Top 10 Towns for Western Canadian real estate investors and is **rated as one of the best municipalities for small business in western Canada**.

Brandon's Keystone Centre is one of the largest consolidated entertainment, convention, agricultural & recreation complexes in Canada, is home to the Brandon Wheat Kings & the Royal Manitoba Winter Fair.

Brandon's economy is expanding with an eye to the future, **home to 2000+ businesses**, Agri-Foods represents the largest industrial cluster.

- Brandon's ties to the agricultural sector are strengthened by the presence of an Agriculture Canada Research Station and the Agri-Environment Centre. These two organizations, along with other local research institutions bring integrated expertise and innovative solutions to the agriculture and Agri-food sector.
- Brandon is situated east of the Bakken Oil Field. Larger than Saudi Arabia's largest oil field, the Bakken Oil Field is estimated to contain 4.3 billion barrels of technically recoverable oil.
- Koch Fertilizer Canada is spending nearly \$130M on upgrades which include building a new headquarters in Brandon that will bring together operations, logistics and sales for more than 100 employees.
- Behlen Industries, the largest manufacturer of steel building systems in Canada, is working on the biggest project in its history for Shell Canada. The project includes the manufacturing of 31 buildings for Shell's Carmon Creek heavy oil development.

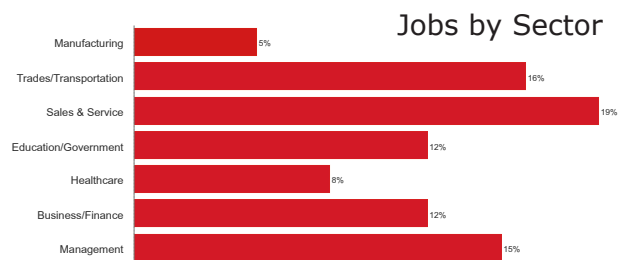
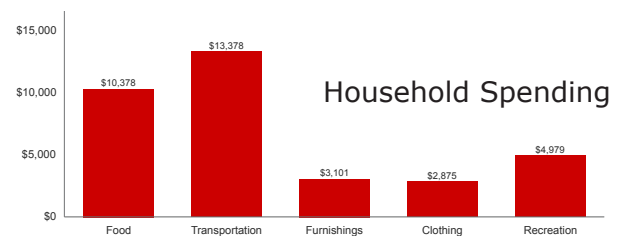
